Description

With the expansion of the use of live donor organs and the increase in the number of non-directed donors, it is important to implement strategies to assure the most appropriate and fair allocation system. This session will explore issues related to three types of organs, liver, kidney and uterus. We will explore how to allocate non-directed organs and the role of a voucher system in expanding non-directed kidney donation. The recent introduction of uterine transplant has opened up a discussion of what factors to consider in the allocation of these organs.

Goals and Objectives:

1. How to allocate anonymous partial livers in a fair and effective way.
2. What is the potential impact of a voucher system for increasing kidney donation.
3. What are the next steps for development of an allocation system in a developing field.
